# Social Studies 8 Course Outline

#### Historical Worldviews Examined

Social Studies provides opportunities for students to develop the attitudes, skills and knowledge that will enable them to become engaged, active, informed and responsible citizens. Grade 8 students will examine issues related to contact between societies with differing worldviews. They will explore elements of worldviews and how these views are expressed by people living in different times and in different places. Through this inquiry, students will reflect on their own worldviews and assess the influence that the past has had on the present. Examples will be drawn from Japanese, Renaissance Europe and Aztec societies.

## **Topics:**

- 1. Worldviews in Conflict: The Spanish and the Aztecs (Sept. Oct.)
  Through an examination of Spanish and Aztec societies, students will
  demonstrate an understanding and appreciation of how intercultural contact
  affects the worldviews of societies.
- 2. From Isolation to Adaptation: Japan (Nov. Jan.)

  Through an examination of Japan, students will demonstrate an understanding and appreciation of the ways in which beliefs, values and knowledge shape worldviews and contribute to a society's isolation or adaptation.
- 3. Origins of a Western Worldview: Renaissance Europe (Feb. Apr.)
  Through an examination of Renaissance Europe, students will demonstrate an understanding and appreciation of how the exchange of ideas and knowledge contributed to shaping the worldview of the Western world.
- 4. Worldview (May June)
  Students will develop an understanding of worldview in relation to the three case studies studied throughout the year: the Aztecs, Japan, and the Renaissance. Students will then explore and reflect on the development of their own worldview.

Current Affairs - (On going)
 Topics of current interest will be discussed by students throughout the year.

## **Classroom Expectations:**

Furthermore, I expect that as young adults, students take responsibility for their actions and always strive to improve.
