New Business • LRSD Capital/Facilities Plan • Capital Facilities Plan	 Suggestion for coordination between the communities to better utilize resources (staff and facilities - gym use, class sizes at high school level, courses Halton is not able to offer due to low enrollment) - perhaps Lundbreck is K-6 or K-9 but high school students come into Pincher. Lundbreck population is more likely to decrease in enrollment (particularly without the ski academy), Pincher has more potential for growth. School enrollment is affected by St. Mike's in the same community. Question about how many Lundbreck students are actually living in the Livingstone School catchment. Are students coming from other catchment areas hurting the enrollment in those students home schools. Lori will chat with Jeff to gather more information.
